


Calavo Basin Sewer Rehabilitation—Phase I



About the Project

PROJECT NAME

Calavo Gardens Sewer Rehabilitation — Phase I

LOCATIONS

Anaheim Drive, Bobbie Lane, Calavo Drive, Calle Verde, Fury Lane, Miguel View Drive, Morning Start Drive, New Morning Road, Queen Avenue, Redondo Drive, and Avocado Blvd.

DESCRIPTION

Otay Water District will be replacing deteriorated or sagging sections of sewer pipe in your neighborhood. As part of the District's comprehensive sewer management program sections of pipe with a higher probability of failure have been identified and will be replaced.

REASON

Using a video camera system, the District inspected sewer pipes in your community. The inspection identified areas where sections of the pipe have sagged. In these sections, heavy debris can accumulate. Over time this could result in a pipeline break or sewer spill. This Project is also part of the District's ongoing sewer maintenance program and serves to prevent costly clogs, brakes, or spills.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the District doing?

Otay Water District will be replacing aging and sagging sewer pipes in your community. The work is being done as part of the District's comprehensive sewer management program. Sewer pipes have been inspected and those sections with a higher probability of failure have been identified and will be replaced.

What are the benefits of the project?

This project will replace sections of aging or sagging sewer pipes, thereby reducing the chance of a clog, break, or spill. Sags are areas where unwanted heavy debris can accumulate. This preventative maintenance can reduce overall maintenance costs, reduce the likelihood of spills, all of which help to keep sewer rates affordable.

How long will it take?

The Calavo Basin Sewer Rehabilitation Project – Phase I will take approximately 6 months to complete (January to June, 2015). Construction will occur in sections, with construction in each section lasting one to two weeks. Visit the Otay Water District website for more information about the project's schedule.

Will my sewer service be affected?

Sewer service will not be affected. Sewer pipes are being replaced in sections; for example, between one manhole and the next. As the process begins, an upstream manhole will be fitted with a pump bypass system. Sewage is then moved through a fully contained roadside relay system to the next downstream manhole.

What are the hours of operation?

Hours of operation will be Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. In areas impacted by morning commutes, construction and traffic control will not begin until after 8:00 a.m. This will allow commuter traffic to dissipate before work begins. ***Please drive carefully in the construction zone.***

Will there be other impacts?

During construction, some dust and noise will be unavoidable. Traffic control and detours will be in place due to the narrowness of some streets. On-street parking restrictions will be in place in those areas where construction activity is occurring. Steel plates will be used to cover open trenches at the end of each work day.

What else should residents expect?

Otay Water District is committed to keeping all of its systems operational, safe and reliable. In doing so, we also strive to keep construction related impacts to a minimum. Throughout this process, we will do our utmost to keep residents, businesses, schools, and churches updated on the progress of the project, and more importantly, what customers can expect in specific areas. Mail delivery and trash collection will not be affected. Trenched areas will also be repaved at the end of the project.
